FLAG ETIQUETTE



When the National Anthem is played ...
When the Flag passes in a parade or in review ...
When the Flag is hoisted or lowered ...
When the Pledge of Allegiance is recited ...

STUDENTS, PARTICIPANTS & SPECTATORS SHOULD:

- face the flag – if visible; face the music – if flag is not visible; face front – if no flag and the music is recorded
- stand at attention & place their right hand (palm open) over their heart
- remove their hat, if male, and hold it at left shoulder with right hand over heart
- when in performance attire (and not performing) remove their head covering and stand at attention
- salute the flag if passing in review, a salute is rendered when the flag is six paces from the viewer and held until it has passed six paces beyond
